2. Qualification Information

2.1 Qualification Purpose

In the UK, Fire Safety Law states that employees must be provided with adequate training. This qualification supports trainers with the knowledge for fire warden delivery whilst developing skills to successfully deliver teaching/training.

This qualification is a holistic introduction and first step to understanding the basics of teaching/training. It provides an insight into the roles, responsibilities and relationships in education and training. It also addresses inclusive teaching and learning approaches, how to facilitate learning for individuals and in group settings, with the principles and practices of assessment.

This qualification focuses on the generic knowledge required to effectively train fire wardens in most organisations and workplace settings. It concentrates on fire awareness and extinguisher training. The units consider hazards and risk, principles and practices of fire safety management and the role of a fire warden and how to use portable firefighting equipment safely.

2.2 Who could take this Qualification?

This qualification attends to the basics of becoming an effective teacher/trainer of fire safety and acts as a springboard for those who may wish to take future teaching/training qualifications.

It is aimed at those who may be preparing for a fire safety teaching/training role, who have just started a fire safety teaching/training role, or who may be looking for an introductory qualification in fire safety teaching/training.
